

Cycling

Paddlesports (Canoeing, Kayaking)

Equine Assisted Learning & Pony Trekking	
This activity includes equine assisted learning activities, working with horses and ponies in stables and in fields, and caring for horses and ponies, and walking on public highways including bridleways and byways open to all traffic with horses and ponies. 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
